Membership:

Our members are almost completely from the three neighboring townships which encompass Glen Lake (Empire, Glen Arbor, & Kasson). ** Everyone's welcome! **

Purpose:

We stimulate the knowledge and love of gardening; aid in the protection of native trees, birds and plants; and participate in community beautification and conservation efforts while spending time with friends both old and new.

Major Projects:

Adopt-a-Highway: We clean-up the stretch of M-109 between M-22 and the turn to Glen Haven three times a year (April, July, and September).

Glen Arbor Beautification: We plant and maintain the plants at the Glen Arbor Garden, Township Hall, annuals at the Township Park, and the barrels located around the business district. Funding for the plants is shared between the Glen Arbor Chamber of Commerce and Glen Arbor Township.

Glen Lake Community Library Planters:

We maintain the planters at the library in Empire.

Greening of the Carl Oleson, Jr. Memorial Bridge:

We assemble and install holiday greens across the Narrows between Big and Little Glen Lakes.

Old Settlers Park Meadow Garden:

We maintain the wildflower meadow garden at Old Settlers Park.

Meetings:

We gather on the third Tuesday of the month during fall, winter, and spring months, at 12:30 PM to enjoy a speaker and program (& some goodies). Most of our meetings take place at the Glen Lake Community Reformed Church in Glen Arbor. We also participate in activities throughout the year – garden tours, field trips, work bees, June Luncheon, etc.
