Fences

SECTION XVII.6 DEFINITIONS

Fence: A barrier enclosing or bordering a field, yard, etc., usually made of vertical posts connected with horizontal sections of sturdy material(s), as wood, metal, vinyl, stone, concrete, wire, or other materials used to prevent entrance, to confine, or to mark a boundary.

SECTION VI.4 FENCES, WALLS, SCREENS

No fence, wall, or screen, of any kind, shall be allowed on a corner lot or parcel, except as may be permitted by the Zoning Board of Appeals.
